

Krell Debuts 600W Preamp

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Krell introduces the Phantom III stereo preamplifier-- the first preamp from the company including either an option digital input module or a headphone input.



The digital input module features AES/EBU, coax and optical digital inputs for use with streaming devices and other digital sources, with 24bit/192kHz LPCM support.

All digital signals feed an ESS Sabre DAC before going to Krell's Current Mode, discrete balanced analog circuitry.

The oversized power supply features a 95VA transformer and 40000 μ F capacitance, giving the preamp the ability to respond quickly to musical demands. The large power supply also improves noise rejection and renders the Phantom III impervious to all but the most severe power fluctuations.

A new eco-friendly standby mode also reduces power consumption to 2W.

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
